PAVEMENT IMPROVEMENTS BEGIN NOVEMBER 4TH

Beginning Wednesday, November 4th, 2009, the area around all hangars will be undergoing pavement improvements. This will mean that you will be unable to access hangars beginning November 4th until Saturday, November 7, 2009. Any change in the weather may delay the reopening of the hangar area as the pavement treatment will need to cure completely prior to allowing anyone access to the area. The taxi line from Gate 7 to the south ramp intersection will also be sealed.

If you plan to use your aircraft, please move it to the main ramp transient area by Tuesday evening, November 3rd. Please notify the Airport office at 707-253-4300 with the N number of the aircraft to avoid overnight fees.

JONESY'S CLOSED OCT. 31st – NOV. 4th

Jonesy' will be closed October 31st at 3:00 p.m. through November 4th and reopen under new management, on November 5th as Jonesy's Steak House and Supper Club.

GLIDESLOPE UPDATE

As part of the preparation for the long awaited Glideslope, part of the hill south of Runway 36L is being removed. This dirt will be used for road improvements.

LPV APPROACH PUBLISHED

The LPV (GPS) approach for Runway 36L was published August 27, 2009. The minimums have a decision altitude of 300 with a HAT of 283 and visibility of 1 statute mile for all aircraft categories on the LPV procedure.

HANGAR UPDATE

There are currently 75 applicants on the hangar waiting list. Shade hangars are available for occupancy at \$100.00 per month. Call Airport Operations at 299-1695 for more information.

PLEASE HELP US RECYCLE

Battery recycle for all types of batteries is available next to the waste oil dump on the south ramp. Place all batteries inside the large, grey bin,

marked "Battery Recycling" and close the lid. *Please do not leave batteries on the ground beside the recycle container.*

Only bottles, cans, clean paper and cardboard can be recycled in the blue bin at the south ramp restrooms. Please do not dispose of used batteries, oil containers or trash in the blue, recycle bin. *Use the trash can for empty oil containers, used paper and food containers.*

Thanks to all our tenants for help with our recycling programs.

SPILL KIT

A spill kit has been placed next to the waste oil dump. Please use it in case of a spill at the oil dump and notify Airport Operations.

RAMP ACCESS AND SPEED ISSUES

Recently, there has been an increase in vehicles which do not belong on the main ramp. Tenants should limit driving to areas around the hangars.

The vehicle speed limit on the Airside is 10 MPH. Speed limit is clearly posted on access gates. For the safety of everyone on the ramp, please do not exceed the speed limit.

AIRPORT STRIPING

To improve the safety and visibility on the Airport, the center line of Runway 18R/36L was recently re-striped. Hold bars at Runway 6/24 were also repainted, and taxiway edge strips were added to the run-up area of Runway 6 and Runway 18R.

REMOTE GATE CLICKERS AVAILABLE

Gate remote clickers are now available to tenants for a fee of \$25.00. Clickers are programmed to open gates 4 – 7. To purchase a clicker, visit the Airport Office during business hours, 8:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00-5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.

TREE TRIMMING AND REMOVAL

The eucalyptus trees around the beacon have been trimmed to provide better visibility. A dead tree has also been removed for your safety.
